

ORDINANCE No. 2207-22

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE VILLAGE CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF HAWTHORN WOODS – TITLE 1, SUBSECTION 1-4-4.E, SETTLEMENT AMOUNTS ENUMERATED; TITLE 3 SUBSECTION 3-1-20.B, FEE SCHEDULE; TITLE 6, CHAPTER 1, VEHICLE LICENSES; TITLE 6, SECTION 6-7-2, VIOLATIONS AUTHORIZING SEIZURE; TITLE 10, SUBSECTION 10-3-7.B.2, CRITERIA FOR REQUIRING A CASH CONTRIBUTION IN LIEU OF PARK SITES; TITLE 11, SECTION 11-1-1, FEES FOR CERTAIN ACTIVITIES AND PURPOSES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Hawthorn Woods, Lake County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE: That Title 1, Subsection 1-4-4.E of the Village Code of the Village of Hawthorn Woods, entitled “Settlement Amounts Enumerated”, is hereby deleted in its entirety and in lieu thereof, the following language shall be substituted:

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SECTION THREE: That Title 6, Chapter 1 of the Village Code of the Village of Hawthorn Woods entitled “VEHICLE LICENSES” be deleted in its entirety, and in lieu thereof the following language shall be substituted:

“Reserved.”

SECTION FOUR: That Title 6, Section 6-7-2 of the Village Code of the Village of Hawthorn Woods entitled, “Violations Authorizing Seizure” is hereby amended by changing the administrative fee to not to exceed seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00).

SECTION FIVE: That Title 10, Subsection 10-3-7.B.2 of the Village Code of the Village of Hawthorn Woods entitled “Criteria For Requiring A Cash Contribution In Lieu of Park Sites” is hereby amended by changing the fair market value of improved land in and surrounding the village to two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000.00) per acre.

SECTION SIX: That Title 11, Section 11-1-1 of the Village Code of the Village of Hawthorn Woods, entitled "FEES FOR CERTAIN ACTIVITIES AND PURPOSES", is hereby deleted in its entirety and in lieu thereof, the following language shall be substituted:

...”The Village Board may, in its discretion, waive any fees and deposits that are not otherwise legally required, and that are established in this chapter for the benefit of any government entity or not-for-profit organizations, except for deposits made to reimburse the Village for costs of professional, architectural, planning, engineering and legal services, utility connection fees and fees used to pay the Village’s out-of-pocket costs, including, but not limited to publication costs, fees for the services of a court reporter, plan reviews and building inspection fees. Where an ordinance or resolution of the village licenses, regulates or otherwise governs a particular activity or purpose, and a fee or charge is provided for in conjunction therewith, the amount of such fee or charge shall be as follows:




