**A RESOLUTION IN RECOGNITION OF THE RETIREMENT OF
EUGENE NICHOLAS GLAUNER, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS**

WHEREAS, Nick Glauner has passionately served the Village of Hawthorn Woods for almost 30 years; and

WHEREAS, Nick Glauner is completing his tenure in public service and plans to retire from the public sector after nearly three decades of governmental service, and

WHEREAS, on July 10, 1995 when first hired, Nick Glauner has served faithfully in the Department of Public Works for the Village of Hawthorn Woods; and

WHEREAS, Nick has served in virtually every capacity and every division within the Public Works domain; and

WHEREAS, Nick has contributed longer to the Public Works department without interruption than any other current employee in the Village of Hawthorn Woods; and

WHEREAS, Nick Glauner has faithfully served the residents of Hawthorn Woods through all of its building phases, participating in the last three decades of construction services and public infrastructure throughout the entire development of town, and

WHEREAS, Nick Glauner has become an integral member of the streets and drainage division and assisted in performing multiple services for the Village including pavement patching, drainage repairs and improvements, roadway improvements, right of way mowing and became proficient in working all of the equipment, especially the temperamental back-hoe that only Nick could maneuver; and

WHEREAS, Nick Glauner was a cornerstone for the Public Works team for the many Village Special Events set ups, including Bark in the Park, the Concerts in the Park, Movies in the Park, Fireworks, Fourth of July Parade, Fall Family Fun Fest, Party in the Park and Hometown Holiday, and assisted with every task requested of him; and

WHEREAS, over the many decades, Nick Glauner:

- Maintained Darlington detour route signage to prevent vehicular accidents
- Pumped water at Midlothian Road by business park
- Patched on Sequoia, Darlington, Schwerman, Highview Circle, the Public Works parking lot, Community Park parking lot and virtually worked on every street in the Village
- Performed storm sewer outfall inspections to meet requirements of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's NPDES Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) program and assisted in keeping our waterways free of illicit discharges
- Performed tree removals at Lagoon Drive, Echo Lake, Equestrian Way and Glen Road to name just a few
- Worked on guard rail repairs and assisted with drainage projects
- Conducted striping projects including stop bars in Hawthorn Grove, Darlington, Bruce Circle, Cardinal, Meadowlark and Schwerman circle and throughout town

- Conducted stop and speed limit sign replacement programs
- Painted curbs for fire lane and added signage for parking, fire lane at the aquatic center and installed the Midlothian delineators for the turn lane into the aquatic center
- Completed replacement of an 18-inch diameter culvert under Carlisle Road
- Completed Deer Point, Deerfield, Squire and Forest View drainage repairs, including concrete replacement and paving where needed and has worked on drainage projects village-wide
- Saved residential homes from flooding by sandbagging, such as the July 2017 flood;
- Served on the Village's Safety Committee for many years; and

WHEREAS, Nick Glauner

- Performed storm sewer repairs at the aquatic center and assisted in the mechanical operations of that facility and all others
- Assisted with Meadowlark drainage, including regular maintenance and assisted with annual preparation prior to America in Bloom's annual visit
- Worked on B&B Park pipe replacement and knows virtually every condition in the entire Village, every electrical panel in any building, and can easily direct staff to the history of current conditions we continue to experience today with our growing infrastructure and equipment inventory; and

WHEREAS, In the early years, Nick worked on virtually every aspect of Village needs, including using his mechanical skills for maintenance of vehicles and equipment (including police vehicles), bringing safety equipment to the department, and working through difficult times with little resources and limited personnel; and

WHEREAS, Nick operated as the Village's JULIE locating coordinator, locating Village utilities daily and responding to emergency JULIE locates at all hours; and


WHEREAS, Nick assisted with the oversight of the construction of the shell of the new Cold Storage Building, as well as assisted with specifying the non-structural concrete slab for the new building; and

WHEREAS, Nick has always been at the top of his game for Village emergencies including snow removal, knows every lane mile of the Village of Hawthorn Woods, and has been the go-to person for emergencies and after-hours calls; and

WHEREAS, on multiple occasions, Nick Glauner has put his community before himself, often sacrificing his personal holidays and vacation time to come into the Village to assist any departmental need.
