




Maze




Count to 10 Maze




Cooking with Kids Recipe

Apple Fruit Donuts

What you will need:

- Apples
- Cream Cheese, Fruit Dip, Peanut Butter, or Whipped Cream
- Sprinkles, Chocolate Chips, or anything to top donuts with
- Food Coloring (optional)
- Apple Corer
- Knife

How to make:

- Slice apples about 3/4 inch thick.
- Use knife or corer to make a hole in the center.
- If you would like, color your cream cheese or fruit dip using the food coloring.
- Spread cream cheese, fruit dip, peanut butter, or whipped cream on top of each apple slice.
- Top with sprinkles or other fun decorations and treats.



Popsicle Stick Tractor

What you will need:

- Popsicle sticks
- Paint
- Paint brush
- Construction paper
- Glue
- Kid friendly scissors

How to make:

- First grab your popsicle sticks. Lay five next to each other {like a fence} one by one, on a flat surface. Now grab your other popsicle sticks and start gluing them the other direction. {Hard to explain but refer to the above picture for example.}
- Once all the popsicle sticks are glued together, set aside to let it all dry completely.
- Once dry, paint the popsicle sticks.
- Cut out some wheels & other tractor truck features from the construction paper.
- To finish, glue the construction paper pieces in place as well as any other embellishments you see fit. {Think rhinestones, glitter etc.}
- Display or play with proudly!

- Cardboard

- Let them be creative with what animals they have at their farm and what crops they grow.




Laundry Basket Skee Ball

What you will need:


- Laundry baskets
- Cardboard
- 5 or more balls
- Paper
- Markers
- Strong tape

How to make:


- Using the cardboard and tape, construct a ramp.
- Use the paper and markers to make signs for the points. Tape the signs to the back inside of the laundry baskets.
- Decide the format of the game.
 - How many rounds?
 - How many balls does each player get each round?
- On one knee, roll the ball up the ramp and into a basket.
- Record the number of points.
- Whoever has the most number of points at the end of all of the rounds wins the game!
