# DIY CRAFT CORNER

## Painted Rock Garden Markers

You will need:

- Smooth rocks
- Acrylic craft paint
- Paintbrushes
- Clear sealant (aerosol)
- Outdoor surface for spraying the sealant (cardboard box, a garbage bag, etc.)

How to make:

- Begin by painting the top half of the rock a solid color. Let dry.
- Paint a second coat. Let dry.
- Flip the rock over and repeat.
- Using a small brush, write the names of the various plants and herbs on the rock face.
- Optional: Add leaves, flowers, designs, etc.
- Let the paint dry completely.
- Set the rocks on the pre-determined spraying surface.
- Use the sealant according to package instructions.
- Add 4-5 coats of sealant.
- Allow to completely dry and then add the rocks into your garden!
- Notes: If preferred, sketch out the designs with a pencil before finalizing designs with paint. Instead of using a paintbrush to write, use a paint marker for better control.

# RECIPE


## Watermelon Feta Salad

### Ingredients:

- ¼ cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- ½ teaspoon kosher salt
- 3 cups cubed seedless watermelon
- 1 cup medium cucumber, chopped
- 1 cup crumbled feta
- ½ cup red onion, thinly slice

### How to make:

- Chop and slice the ingredients as specified.
- In the small bowl, whisk together the olive oil, red wine vinegar, and salt.
- In the large serving bowl, combine watermelon, cucumber, feta, red onion, and mint.
- Garnish with more mint and/or flaky sea salt

# VIRTUAL TOUR OF FLORIDA BEACHES


